#### **About Department**

The Department of Geography, Osmania University, started in 1942 and was offering M.A Geography since 1955 and P.G. Diploma in Geographical Cartography since 1967 apart from M.Phil. and Ph.D. It is the oldest Geography Department in South India. The Department introduced M.Sc. Geoinformatics in 2005. The Department received generous grants from DST – FIST (twice during 2005-2010 and 2013-2018) and UGC by way of DSA–SAP, UGC–ASIST (2005 to 2010) and later the upgradation of the department to the level of Centre for Advanced Study in 2013 (the first phase is from 2013 to 2018). All the funding was possible because of glorious history of the department and the sincere efforts of the faculty members in the past. With the help of these funding and supports, the department has strengthened the facilities of GIS, Remote Sensing and GPS. The Department has 9 labs – Cartography and Survey labs (Old labs with the department funds), GIS Lab (UGC - SAP Phase II and IV Grant), Soil lab (UGC - SAP Phase IV Grant), Geoinformatics lab (DST – FIST Grant 1st Phase), Image Processing lab (UGC - ASIST Grant), Photogrammetry lab (UGC - ASIST Grant), Advanced Remote Sensing Lab (DST - FIST Grant 2nd Phase) and Advanced Spatial Information Technology Lab (UGC - CAS I Grant).

## **About IGS**

The Indian Geographical Society (IGS), the oldest Geographical Society in India, initiated its existence on 31<sup>st</sup> March 1925 and officially inaugurated in Chennai (Madras) on 16.3.1926 at Presidency College Campus by a team of Indian and British Geographers, lead by Mr. N. Subrahmanyam M.A., L.T., F.R.G.S., the Chair of Geography at Teachers' College, Saidapet, Chennai. At present, the Society is housed at the Department of Geography, University of Madras, Chennai. The IGS is bi-annually publishing The Indian Geographical Journal since 1926. From its inception, the Journal is maintaining its quality and contributing to the development of geography in various spheres of the discipline. In 1941, the Madras Geographical Journal was renamed as the Indian Geographical Journal, with the ambition to broaden its scope to the national level. The Society was very much appreciated by eminent British Geographers like Professors Fawcett, Ogilvie, Dudley Stamp and others.
